
# Global Knowledge Economy



# Ontogenesis of Academic Journals

- Targeting appropriate journals
- 1.Aims and scope
- 2.Editorial board (editors(s), editorial board members)
- 3.(Biblio)metric data [e.g., indexes (Web of Science, Scopus, etc.), impact factor, citation index, most cited works, etc.]
- 4. Publisher [Elsevier, Wiley, Taylor & Francis (Routledge), Springer]



# Ontogenesis of Academic Journals

- 5.Ranking (Q1,2,3,4)
- 6.Publication strategy (Publication intervals (volume, issue), open access, subscription, (blind) review process, soliciting mechanism)
- 7. Author's guidelines (publication genres, submission process, review process, timeline for decision, stylistic preferences, etc.)
- 8.Call for proposals and special issues



# Targeting Appropriate Journals: Strategies

- Pay attention to what you read
- Research journals (journals websites)
- Consult experienced members of your academic community
- Visit Ulrichsweb & Scimago
- Contact editors
- Subscribe to journal feeds, newsletters, listserves



#### Targeting Inappropriate Journals: Risks

- Desk rejection
- Waste of time and efforts
- Affective and emotional challenges (discouragement, burnout, disappointment, etc.)
- Refashioning the whole manuscript
- Predatory publishers and financial costs
- Academic prestige and ethical concerns

#### Publication Process: Behind The Scene

- Online editorial management system:
- 1. Creating an account
- 2.Filling out online forms (e.g., affliation, abstract, key words, conflict of interest, suggesting reviewers, GAI statement, etc.)
- 3. Uploading the manuscript, checking the pdf generated by the system, submission
- 4. Write a cover letter addressed to the editor
- 5.Blind the manuscript (e.g., Habibie, 2019 (Author, Year) or (Blinded)
- 6. Make sure that you contact information is correct and updated
- 7.Do not make double/multiple submissions



#### Publication Process: Behind The Scene

- At the editor's end
- 1. Notification email regarding a new submission
- 2. Assigning editor
- 3.Technical check (appropriateness, originality, empirical quality and rigour, language, anonymity, similarity, GAI-generatedness)
- 4.Desk-reject, send back to the author(s) for revision, send out for review
- 5.Inviting reviewers (research area, reference list, author's suggestions, etc.)
- 6.Start of the peer-review process (2-3 months or more)

#### Publication Process: Behind The Scene

- At the reviewer's end
- 1. Peer review (appropriateness, originality, scholarly rigour, language)
- 2.Reviewer's report (Rubric, textual report, notes to the editor)
- 3. Conflicting reports & extra reviews
- 4. Editor's decision: Accept, reject, major revisions, minor revisions
- 5. Relaying the report to the author(s) (clarity, politeness, etc.)
- 6. Sharing reports with the other reviewer (editor's decision)



# Publication Process: Negotiation With Gatekeepers

- Critical comments & feedback
- Emotional aspect (disappointment, anger, self-doubt, imposter syndrome, etc.)
- Put aside review reports for a few days
- Review process: Enhancement of your work, communication, & negotiation
- Attend to all comments (suggestions vs. requirements)
- Give explicit justification and reasons for revisions & rebuttals
- Seek advice from experienced members of your academic community
- •Contact editors regarding confusing comments, deadlines, meeting arrangements, etc.)



# Publication Process: Negotiation With Gatekeepers

Before itemizing the revisions, the author would like to thank the two anonymous reviewers for their comments on this manuscript and appreciate the opportunity to resubmit the manuscript for reconsideration.

#### **Reviewers' Comments (reviewer # 1)**

The manuscript extensively discusses current debates around Large Language Models (LLMs) and their impact on scholarly publication. To strengthen the manuscript, it would be beneficial to clearly articulate its unique contributions to these discussions or to the broader field of L2 writing. Identifying specific insights or frameworks that your work introduces would greatly enhance its value A social justice framework has been added as the theoretical/analytical lens. This framework helps to analyze the affordances and limitations of GAI tools for alleviating/exacerbating socio-economic and symbolic forms of social (in)justice in the current knowledge economy. Although designated as a conceptual paper, it remains unclear which particular concept the manuscript aims to explore—be it the knowledge economy, GAI/LLM, or scholarly publication?

#### Responses

As stated above, a theoretical framework has been added and particular concepts and notions have been used in framing the discussion. This is not a research paper as agreed with the editors of this special issue. The paper was framed as a conceptual paper that aims to examine the practical implications of GAI in today's knowledge system. The arrangements were made at the time of submitting the abstract/ proposal for the paper.

- Create a sense of communication, negotiation, and respect
- Blind your revisions and the revised manuscript
- Resubmit by the deadline
- At the editor's end
- 1.Technical check
- 2.(Re)inviting (new) reviewers
- 3.Peer review
- 4. Editor's decision
- 5. Repeated process
- 6. Final verdict: Accept/reject
- 7. Unblind the manuscript, submit the original word file, sign copyrights form
- 8. Publication (open access/ subscribed)




# Writing A Manuscript: IMRaD Format

- Thesis vs. Research article
- •Introduction: CARS Model (Swales, 1990) (originality, timeliness, significance)
- •Literature review: Critical, comprehensive, recent
- Theoretical framework
- Methodological framework: Description & justification
- Results/Findings
- Discussion: Significance, situatedness in the literature, evidence-based and warranted claims
- Reference list:Stylistic preferences, matching in-text citations
- •Language: formality, grammar, spelling, citations, quotations, etc.



# **Predatory Publishing**

- •Journals which "exploit the author-pays, Open-Access model for their own profit" (Beall, 2010, p. 15).
- •Predatory journals and publishers are entities that prioritize self-interest at the expense of scholarship and are characterized by false or misleading information, deviation from best editorial and publication practices, a lack of transparency, and/or the use of aggressive and indiscriminate solicitation practices. (Grudniewicz et al., 2019, p. 211)
- •Discourse of predation, non-rigorous peer review process, broad areas of scholarship or very niche areas)
- •Incentives (e.g., fast publication, editorial board membership)
- Open access (OA)
